

Pioneer Prayer Pack 15 September 28 - October 5, 2019

Directions: One day this week, in the sanctuary, outside under some trees, in a comfortable room that offers privacy and no distractions, or on a conference call, the leader will distribute prayer packets, welcome participants, and open with a short prayer. Group members take turns reading the "Testimony Handout" (pg. 3). After reading, the group leader will assign prayer topics below to participants in a clockwise fashion. Each should pray silently for a minute about their prayer request. The group leader may open the prayer by thanking God for every person in the room and asking that each heart will be blessed. Before someone prays for their assigned topic, they should try and agree with the previous prayer. The prayer topics below are taken from the "Testimony Handout." Please keep individual prayers short, or less than two minutes each.

- 1. Pray that many of God's people will unite in revival and preparation for Jesus' coming.
- 2. Pray that God's judgment day will find us obedient and humble.
- 3. Pray that we will recognize warnings to events about to take place.
- 4. Pray that God's children will be thirsty for His word before it is too late.

[3-5 min. Open Prayer Time; Song leader sings first verse of Hymn #604 (pg. 2) to end open prayer time]

- 5. Pray that people will hear the "last warning message to the world, announcing that Christ is at the door and calling attention to God's broken law."
- 6. Pray for salvation in Christ by a knowledge of Him.
- 7. Pray that we will overcome temptations and life's challenges, to win heaven.
- 8. Pray that we will have God's love in our hearts.
- 9. Pray for the growth and the development of this Revival Plan project.

[3-5 min. Open Prayer Time; Song leader sings second verse of Hymn #604 (pg. 2) to end open prayer time]

- 10. Pray for the governments of the countries in which we live.
- 11. Pray for our local mission's leadership, projects, and needs.
- 12. Pray for our Church leaders as they prepare for Annual Council.
- 13. Pray for our Church leaders as they prepare for General Conference Session in 2020.
- 14. Pray that the Testimonies for the Church may be introduced to every member of the church.

[3-5 min. Open Prayer Time – Thanksgiving and Praise; Finish Hymn #604 (pg. 2); Leader Closes Prayer]

"The great day of the Lord is near, it is near, and hasteth greatly, even the voice of the day of the Lord: the mighty man shall cry there bitterly. That day is a day of wrath, a day of trouble and distress, a day of wasteness and desolation, a day of darkness and gloominess, a day of clouds and thick darkness, a day of the trumpet and alarm against the fenced cities, and against the high towers. And I will bring distress upon men, that they shall walk like blind men, because they have sinned against the Lord."

"And it shall come to pass at that time, that I will search Jerusalem with candles, and punish the men that are settled on their lees: that say in their heart, The Lord will not do good, neither will He do evil."

"Gather yourselves together, yea, gather together, O nation not desired; before the decree bring forth, before the day pass as the chaff, before the fierce anger of the Lord come upon you, before the day of the Lord's anger come upon you. Seek ye the Lord, all ye meek of the earth, which have wrought His judgment; seek righteousness, seek meekness: it may be ye shall be hid in the day of the Lord's anger."

We are near the close of time. I have been shown that the retributive judgments of God are already in the land. The Lord has given us warning of the events about to take place. Light is shining from His word; yet darkness covers the earth, and gross darkness the people. "When they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them; . . . and they shall not escape."

It is our duty to inquire the cause of this terrible darkness, that we may shun the course by which men have brought upon themselves so great delusion. God has given the world an opportunity to learn and to obey His will. He has given them, in His word, the light of truth; He has sent them warning, counsel, and admonition; but few will obey His voice. Like the Jewish nation, the majority, even of professed Christians, pride themselves on their superior advantages, but make no returns to God for these great blessings. In infinite mercy a last warning message has been sent to the world, announcing that Christ is at the door and calling attention to God's broken law. But as the antediluvians rejected with scorn the warning of Noah, so will the pleasure lovers of today reject the message of God's faithful servants. The world pursues its unvarying round, absorbed as ever in its business and its pleasures, while the wrath of God is about to be visited on the transgressors of His law.

Our compassionate Redeemer, foreseeing the perils that would surround His followers at this time, has given them special warning: "Take heed to yourselves, lest at any time your hearts be overcharged with surfeiting, and drunkenness, and cares of this life, and so that day come upon you unawares. For as a snare shall it come on all them that dwell on the face of the whole earth. Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man." If the church pursue a course similar to that of the world, they will share the same fate. Nay, rather, as they have received greater light, their punishment will be greater than that of the impenitent.

We as a people profess to have truth in advance of every other people upon the earth. Then our life and character should be in harmony with such a faith. The day is just upon us when the righteous shall be bound like precious grain in bundles for the heavenly garner, while the wicked are, like the tares, gathered for the fires of the last great day. But the wheat and tares "grow together until the harvest." In the discharge of life's duties the righteous will to the last be brought in contact with the ungodly. The children of light are scattered among the children of darkness, that the contrast may be seen by all. Thus are the children of God to "show forth the praises of Him who hath called you out of darkness into His marvelous light." The divine love glowing in the heart, the Christ like harmony manifested in the life, will be as a glimpse of heaven granted to men of the world that they may see and appreciate its excellence.

Memory Tips:

- 1. Ask God for help learning these verses!
- 2. Listen to the Revival Plan podcast daily while driving, walking, or working.
- 3. Drink three quarts of water, exercise, and sleep sufficiently daily to increase circulation of oxygenated blood to your brain!
- 4. When you memorize a verse, repeat it once from memory daily for 40 days.
- 5. Be persistent and consistent!
- 6. Choose God's Word over other less important media throughout the day.
