



Pioneer Prayer Pack 16

October 6-12, 2019

Directions: One day this week, in the sanctuary, outside under some trees, in a comfortable room that offers privacy and no distractions, or on a conference call, the leader will distribute prayer packets, welcome participants, and open with a short prayer. Group members take turns reading the “Testimony Handout” (pg. 2). After reading, the group leader will assign prayer topics below to participants in a clockwise fashion. Each should pray silently for a minute about their prayer request. The group leader may open the prayer by thanking God for every person in the room and asking that each heart will be blessed. Before someone prays for their assigned topic, they should try and agree with the previous prayer. The prayer topics below are taken from the “Testimony Handout.” Please keep individual prayers short, or less than two minutes each.

1. Pray that we experience the power of truth and faith in our own hearts and lives.
2. Pray that we have the Spirit of Christ so we may work as He worked.
3. Pray that we understand the teachings of Jesus and present them to the people.
4. Pray that we love Christ and love people as He did.
5. Pray that we practice the Heavenly principles that we offer to others.
6. Pray that we become good examples in all the places we go and in all areas of our lives.

[3-5 min. Open Prayer Time; Song leader sings first verse of Hymn #309 (pg. 2) to end open prayer time]

7. Pray to understand and have Jesus’ character.
8. Pray for protection of God’s people in times of trouble. Isaiah 26:20
9. Thank God that we can stand when He comes with His gift of righteousness. Isaiah 13:6-7
10. Pray that God will purify our faith so it will be precious in His sight. Isaiah 13:12-13
11. Thank God that He will judge the opposers of His people. Isaiah 17:12-14
12. Pray that God’s children desire God’s Word with passion and turn their hearts to it.

[3-5 min. Open Prayer Time; Song leader sings second verse of Hymn #309 (pg. 2) to end open prayer time]

13. Pray that God’s church prepares and revives now for the crisis ahead.
14. Pray for Annual Council happening this week in preparation for General Conference Session 2020.
15. Pray for General Conference Session on June 25, 2020.
16. Pray for church leaders and their families.
17. Pray for revival and reformation throughout churches, conferences, unions, divisions, and General Conference departments.
18. Pray for Adventist leaders from every country.

[3-5 min. Open Prayer Time – Thanksgiving and Praise; Finish Hymn #309 (pg. 2); Leader Closes Prayer]

The plan of salvation is not presented in its simplicity for the reason that few ministers know what simple faith is. An intellectual knowledge of the truth is not enough; we must know its power upon our own hearts and lives. Ministers need to come to Christ as little children. Seek Jesus, brethren, confess your sins, plead with God day and night, until you know that for Christ's sake you are pardoned and accepted. Then will you love much because you have been forgiven much. Then you can point others to Christ as a sin-pardoning Redeemer. Then you can present the truth from the fullness of a heart that feels its sanctifying power. I fear for you, my brethren. I counsel you to tarry at Jerusalem, as did the early disciples, until, like them, you receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit. Never feel at liberty to go into the desert until you have by faith grasped the arm of your strength.

If we have the spirit of Christ we shall work as He worked; we shall catch the very ideas of the Man of Nazareth and present them to the people. If, in the place of formal professors and unconverted ministers, we were indeed followers of Christ we would present the truth with such meekness and fervor, and would so exemplify it in our lives, that the world would not be continually questioning whether we believe what we profess. The message borne in the love of Christ, with the worth of souls constantly before us, would win even from worldlings the decision: "They are like Jesus."

If we desire to reform others, we must ourselves practice the principles which we would enforce upon them. Words, however good, will be powerless if contradicted by the daily life. Ministers of Christ, I admonish you: "Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine." Do not excuse sins in yourselves which you reprove in others. If you preach on meekness and love, let these graces be exemplified in your own life. If you urge others to be kind, courteous, and attentive at home, let your own example give force to your admonitions. As you have received greater light than others, so is your responsibility increased. You will be beaten with many stripes if you neglect to do your Master's will.

Satan's snares are laid for us as verily as they were laid for the children of Israel just prior to their entrance into the land of Canaan. We are repeating the history of that people. Lightness, vanity, love of ease and pleasure, selfishness, and impurity are increasing among us. There is need now of men who are firm and fearless in declaring the whole counsel of God; men who will not sleep as do others but watch and be sober. Knowing as I do the great lack of holiness and power with our ministers, I am deeply pained to see the efforts for self-exaltation. If they could but see Jesus as He is, and themselves as they are, so weak, so inefficient, so unlike their Master, they would say: If my name may be written in the obscurest part of the book of life, it is enough for me, so unworthy am I of His notice.

It is your work to study and to imitate the Pattern. Was Christ self-denying? so must you be. Was He meek and lowly? so must you be. Was He zealous in the work of saving souls? so must you be. Did He labor to promote the glory of His Father? so must you. Did He often seek help from God? so must you. Was Christ patient? so will you be patient. As Christ forgave His enemies, so will you forgive.

MEMORY VERSES

“Come, my people, enter thou into thy chambers, and shut thy doors about thee: hide thyself as it were for a little moment, until the indignation be overpast” (Isaiah 26:20).

“Howl ye; for the day of the Lord is at hand; it shall come as a destruction from the Almighty. Therefore shall all hands be faint, and every man's heart shall melt” (Isaiah 13:6-7).

“I will make a man more precious than fine gold; even a man than the golden wedge of Ophir. Therefore I will shake the heavens, and the earth shall remove out of her place, in the wrath of the Lord of hosts, and in the day of his fierce anger” (Isaiah 13:12-13).

Memory Tips:

1. Ask God for help learning these verses!
2. Listen to the Revival Plan podcast daily while driving, walking, or working.
3. Drink three quarts of water, exercise, and sleep sufficiently daily to increase circulation of oxygenated blood to your brain!
4. When you memorize a verse, repeat it once from memory daily for 40 days.
5. Be persistent and consistent!
6. Choose God's Word over other less important media throughout the day.
7. Share verses you learn with others.
